The intention is to increase the stall pitch cost slightly on last year and coupled with taking bookings for stalls and ticket sales at least 2 months in advance of the Pride date - this will aid with cash flow.





The aims and outcomes of Chippy CLT are entirely local community focussed and for the benefit of all people of Chipping Norton. We are encouraging as many local residents as possible to become members of the CLT to enable them to participate in community led affordable housing development and potentially the management of community assets.

The intention is that community led affordable housing will be developed to address the needs of the local community in a sustainable and inclusive way. It will be owned in perpetuity by the Trust for occupation by local people. The Trust will be controlled by the local community by its trustee and membership structure.

The Trust is also seeking opportunities to potentially own and manage local community assets and facilities for the benefit of the local community where these assets are currently not protected and/or fully operated for the benefit of the local community.

There exist many Community Land Trusts across the UK and within Oxfordshire with a proven track record of delivering successful projects but all require funds to support overheads. For example, in Hook Norton, Hooky CLT delivered a new development of 8 affordable housing units and a community hall in 2024.

Aims:

To reduce isolation and loneliness and increase resilience by connecting local people with other members of the community of all ages and backgrounds. We will do this by creating a welcoming space offering weekly community-led arts and crafts activities. This will establish connections across generations and create a thriving supportive community for all.

The sessions will be facilitated by Emma Polin and Cara Hedges and supported by volunteers from the community.

This will take the form of an open café-style setting, with a mixture of drop-in free-flowing craft activities and more structured workshops run by local people according to interests.

It will give people opportunities to express themselves, discover and develop skills they didn't know they had, work alongside others, and feel empowered to share their knowledge and ideas with people of all ages.

This will bridge generational divides and create a mutually supportive network of friendships to reduce loneliness across different age groups and create a more connected community- for those who are retired, working from home, in part time work or unemployed, and to support families with under 18s who are not in full time educational settings for various reasons (whether they be pre-schoolers, members of the home education community or those who are not accessing full time formal education provision for other reasons).

There will be refreshments on offer so people who do not feel they are crafty can come along and have something to eat or drink and take in the atmosphere, and gradually take part with whatever level of engagement feels comfortable to them.

The sessions will be based on the Eastern side of the town where currently there is limited provision for community or craft activities.

There will be opportunities for volunteering and providing peer support, and increase a sense of belonging, wellbeing and social cohesion amongst those who come.

Meeting needs:

In Chipping Norton, people of all ages are experiencing loneliness, disconnection, and difficulty accessing adequate support from services intended to provide care. The Chipping Norton Craft Café directly addresses these needs by creating an inclusive, supportive space for creativity, connection, and skills-sharing. Being run by a community group helps ensure that people who are wary of institutions for various reasons can feel ownership over this setting and how sessions are run.

How will you measure the impact of your project?

We anticipate between 20 and 40 people accessing each session, with a core group of people each week becoming regulars, some occasional visitors and some newcomers each time. We anticipate sessions being busier during school holidays as people will bring their school-age children and grandchildren to take part in craft sessions.

St Mary's Minis is a Baby and Toddler Group that has been running for 50 years. It's on a Wednesday and now runs from The Branch trust building in the centre of town. We open at 9.15 am for breakfast so that mums with older children can come straight from school and no one is waiting in the cold. The move has brought significant growth to the group and increased it's diversity. It's location means that families are connected to all the other services the Branch has to offer like Connect Café, CAP money advice and CAB. It also works in reverse: families attending groups and services like those above and also OXPIP, Own my life, Life skills etc. can easily be introduced to Minis, see us in action and receive a warm welcome.

As well as the usual provision of appropriate toys, sensory activity, craft, breakfast and coffee the volunteers work the room and offer support, advice and signposting. It has become a community that supports each other, but it also welcomes new people. For example a man with a baby in a mental health crisis made it to The Branch to collect a food voucher. He had not been out of the house for six months. The volunteer on reception told him Minis was running and to come and join us. He was too anxious and the volunteer called me to chat to him. I then asked one of our regular dad's to come out to him and they talked for a long time. We had supported this Dad when he came to Minis and admitted he was suicidal. He was now supporting a new Dad and told him that coming to the group had been the best thing he ever did.

This is the difference our new location makes. I would be very grateful for the donation to help purchase climbing equipment for gross motor skills. This would support the children aged 3-4 who are more active. We would also like to continue to provide a healthy breakfast as the cost of living is not yet improving. People come to us for warmth and food to save on their own bills.

At present we have 35 regular young people on average, with numbers ranging from 28-43 each week. This number has grown over the last 6 months and increased by around 5 since our last application. We have seen a growing number young people attending with SEND diagnosis or additional needs (based on registration forms, around 40% of the young people) and have found that these young people feel safe and included at Remix. Some has expressed finding the school week hard, but looking forward to Remix.

It benefits the community because it provides a safe space for the young people to spend a couple of hours with their peers, having fun, getting to know each other, enjoying activities, letting off steam from the week, and in some cases having a chance to speak with trusted adults to share about their weeks if they feel they would like to.

One of the great impacts of Remix is through the positive interactions between the young people and adult leaders who volunteer. The volunteer team are committed and regular, meaning the young people know which adults to expect to see and relationships are being built. This soft influence means that positive, encouraging conversations are happening and the young people are growing in confidence in interacting with different people in society.

Remix has been running for 8 years now and has an established place in the community and in the minds of the young people. We see siblings joining of older, alumni young people and can see that the it continues to be an important part of the week for a number of young people.

We booked additional activities last summer such as climbing and archery. Many of the young people said they hadn't done climbing before and hoped we would book it again, so have for later in the spring term. We will also book 'farm for a day' and the virtual reality gaming bus, subject to receiving a grant to cover the cost of these activities. Our desire is to provide new opportunities for the young people, to challenge them and grow their confidence.

This will be a day of positive activities in the heart of the community in Chipping Norton. Many of the activities themselves will be led by young people from the estate, along with a number of local organisations who are involved in supporting the community in a variety of different ways.

As well as providing a fun day out for children, teenagers and families, the activities offered will help connect people with different opportunities that will extend beyond the day at the park, giving a greater knowledge of the support available in our local area and promoting long term resilience. It will bring community members together in one space, and create positive memories for children and families to look back on in future years, important for long term mental health.

We were inspired to support the running of this event, hearing from teenagers who attended 8 years ago how much they still remember the fun they had despite the torrential rain that day. We are still recovering from the effects of covid, and the changing culture that means children and young people are increasingly spending time on screens and struggling to deal with anxiety. This event will get them outside, being active, interacting with others and discovering opportunities for having fun in a creative, practical way. This is so important for healthy development, both physically and mentally, for learning skills to deal with anxiety and stress and for creating an empowered peer support group for people of all ages.

The last two years we have helped run this event alongside Oxfordshire Play Association and it has gone from strength to strength, gaining more diverse public engagement as word spreads.

People can join in for free, and the event will be advertised widely in Chipping Norton to ensure it benefits local residents.

How will you measure the impact of your project?

We will collect feedback from visiting families, young people and stall holders to find out what they felt was positive about the day. Some of this will take place on the day and some several weeks later, as we have found that people reflect back and notice other things that they found beneficial over time. We will produce a report on the day to highlight the positive outcomes.

If awarded a grant last year from CNTC could you please state how the funds helped your organisation and what they were used for.

We received a grant of £750 last year, and the funds were used to support our Swap Shop and Repair Café Social events. These have been a vital way of ensuring that people have practical positive things that they can do to help encourage a culture of circular economy. By being able to bring people together over some central themes, we are helping to connect people with similar ideals, and this is generating stronger links across the community, and enabling other projects to start to take shape in the local area.

Project Details

The purchase of a new drone for Lowland Rescue Oxfordshire will significantly enhance search & rescue operations both in Chipping Norton as well as the rest of Oxfordshire. Drones offer the ability to quickly cover large, difficult to reach terrains, providing real-time aerial footage that aids in locating missing persons faster and more accurately. This technology will help improve the efficiency of rescue missions, ensuring quicker response times and, ultimately, saving lives. Drones can also assist in situations where traditional methods – such as ground teams – may be limited due to terrain or weather conditions.
The project will be delivered through a coordinated effort between Lowland Rescue Oxfordshire, local authorities and the community. Each of our volunteers live in Oxfordshire and they will be involved in the operational aspects, including drone piloting and mission coordination. Training sessions will ensure volunteers are equipped with the necessary skills to operate the new technology safely and effectively.
Local residents can support the project by participating in events or volunteering their time. Additionally, the community can spread awareness of the importance of the initiative and the Search & Rescue work that our charity provides, encouraging others to contribute, This collaboration between LRO and the people of Chipping Norton will create a stronger, more connected network for safety and support, ultimately making the area a safer place for everyone.

How will you measure the impact of your project?

- 1) Response Time Improvement: One of the primary benefits of using drones is the reduction in response times. By comparing the time taken to locate individuals before & after the introduction of the drone, we can measure how much quicker search & rescue missions are carried out.
- 2) Search Area coverage: Drones can cover vast areas more quickly than ground teams. WE can track the efficiency of the drones by calculating how much more ground is being covered in a given time period.
- 3) Feedback from rescue teams: Gathering feedback from the team about how the drone has affected their missions, including improvements in operational coordination will offer valuable insights into its practical impact.

Project Details

Please tell us in no more, than 300 words, about your project. Who will your project benefit, how will it be delivered, how can people join in...

We currently have 167 children regularly collecting our free school meals (FSM), a number which is growing every holiday. Our FSM community have faced increasing challenges over the past year with the cost of living crisis, and many are facing additional challenges currently including domestic abuse, kindship and foster care, refugee needs, SEN support needs and social services involvement in families. We are currently funded by Wise Investments, Aldi, Open Doors corporate sponsors, our firewalk, race running and other community fundraising to continue to offer food vouchers. This costs an enormous amount at over £16,000 a year. We are committed to this programme, with the help of our supporters, and so where we really value and need the support of the Town Council is to be able to maintain our arts engagement programme for our FSM families. We are really grateful for the £1,000 grant awarded earlier in the year, but conscious that this means us delivering a very pared down offering, and we would love to be able to give local families who are struggling a really rich, varied creative and cultural offering, to enrich their children's lives and support families to come together.

This programme brings so much fun and joy for young people and for the whole family at our craft mornings, Easter trail, summer scavenger hunt and Christmas Santa event, with take-home craft packs and free film screenings being reported as invaluable by parents and carers for giving children something special to do in the holidays and to report back to friends at school. We also see their real benefit in bringing the community together, building friendships and support systems, as well a breaking down barriers to engagement at the theatre and getting people more and more involved and able to independently access everything we have to offer. In the calendar year we want to be able to offer:

- 8 free arts and craft resource packs for 170 young people throughout the holidays
- 4 free family films in the Theatre's cinema
- 2 free arts and craft workshops at the Theatre
- 2 free trails our Easter trail and summer scavenger hunt
- 1 extra special Christmas craft workshop with Santa*

This year we want to add an even bigger sprinkle of magic to our Christmas event* and see if we can create an opportunity for every child to meet Santa in person and have that special, magical moment in December. The Chair of our Board is poised to play Santa, but we currently do not have any funding for Santa to give tiny gifts, and would love to be able to have him give small, creative and arty gifts to children who are unlikely to have very much this Christmas.

With £1,000 already awarded towards the total £3,030 costs to deliver the arts-led activities of the Free School Holiday Lunches and Arts programme, we are therefore submitting a further application for £2,030 to fully fund these elements. The additional funding will allow us to reintroduce the free holiday films across the remaining holiday periods, fund our community tickets for Panto (as without your support we only have 50 we can earmark), deliver that extra special Christmas Santa experience, the Easter Trail and fully fund the workshop and art packs through to May 2025.





How will you measure the impact of your project?

We always monitor and evaluate all our community projects at the theatre and look for quantitative and qualitative impact through:

- Evidence of meeting need are we reaching those who really need support, in this case those entitled to FSM / pupil premium and families struggling due to low income, and are we providing them with what they most value. We evaluate this through feedback and our anonymous surveys.
- Evidence of growing a relationship tracking the ladder of engagement to study how the
 community extend their engagement with us over years, in this case engaging with other
 opportunities like community tickets, parent groups, HAF programme and year-round bursary
 places. Our booking system Spektrix allows us to evaluate this, alongside the invaluable
 relationships we form with families which means we have lovely anecdotal evidence in the stories
 they have shared with us and the relationships they have built at the theatre.
- Evidence of impact and what difference the programme has made we ask people and gather their thoughts through our chats with families, email feedback and our annual anonymous survey, and also through inviting the community to join us in delivering the programme and being on the inside of everything. We have free school meal parents who drove supplied from Aldi to the theatre in their cars, who manned the BBQ at our summer Lido day, and we always welcome involvement, ideas and participation that shape and change our programme.

For the first time, the theatre is also engaging in a new formal method of evaluation – the Old Fire Station Oxford's Storytelling evaluation methodology. Our free school meal community will be among the participants invited to tell their stories and share their deeper thoughts on the programme through this.

If awarded a grant last year from CNTC could you please state how the funds helped your organisation and what they were used for.

At the Theatre we are really grateful to be supported by the Town Council. The Council generously supports us with a core grant which keeps our doors open — without this crucial core support we cannot keep going, and we are incredibly grateful for this. We have also been very grateful to have the support of the communities committee for our free school meals arts programme for the past two years, and your support for the beginning of this year As you can imagine, with all our community activities funding is very tight, and we have spent every penny we are awarded directly on the families. Our report on last year's expenditure and activities was submitted in July alongside our earlier application which was initially awarded £1,000 of the total £3,030 needed.

With your extra support we can build a stronger, better and more enriching third year on the programme which the communities committee so generously launched in 2022. Thanks to your help we have strong foundations to build on. Watching this project grow, impact local families, getting to know them and welcoming them more and further into our organisation has been extraordinary. Our Youth Theatre programme is now over 50% bursary participants, we have welcomed FSM parents into our mental health and SEN Parent groups, three of the four children starring in our community show *Barn Dance* were young people from our FSM programme. The free school meal programme is not only vital in and of itself to support families, but for so many it's a stepping stone to transforming lives through the arts. We would be so grateful if you would consider fully funding this element as it is the way in to so many other experiences and activities for struggling local low-income families.
